Objectives: By providing an opportunity for exchanging experiences, lessons learned, identifying successes, needs and challenges, the main goal of this session is producing short and long-term recommendations to mainstream adaptation to impacts in ocean and coastal areas while seizing opportunities towards a climate resilient Blue Economy. It builds on raising awareness on the perils of impacts by GHG emissions on ocean and coastal zones under 1.5°C of global warming, and the need for a coherent and coordinated framework (also) within the EU process to articulate a climate-ocean policy interface for ocean and coasts from global to local climate action. It recalls that (adaptation on) ocean and coastal zones play a crucial role in achieving the sustainable development goals (SDGs), and the Paris Agreement global goal for enhancing adaptive capacity, strengthening resilience, and reducing vulnerability to climate change.

Framing questions: What are the best and innovative practices and finance mechanisms for building resilience and adaptation to impacts by anthropogenic GHG emissions and climate change?; What does works and what does not work?; What kind of professional profile, capacities, knowledge and research are needed to address impacts and to build a Blue Economy climate resilient?
